Local Day of Action

On Thursday 13 August, local officers from Chichester Neighbourhood Policing Team carried out a day of action targeting the issue of speeding vehicles, driving whilst using a mobile telephone and driving without a seatbelt in the area of St Pauls Road, Little Breach and Old Broyle Road, Chichester.

Police Sergeant Chris White said “We have listened to local residents who have raised concerns to us about speeding in and around their communities. This day will form part of an ongoing operation where we will continue to work with local neighbourhoods to deal with the issue of speeding and other road related offences.”

During the day a three £60 fixed penalty notices were issued for speeding, three £60 fixed penalty notices issued for driving whilst on a mobile phone and 27 £60 fixed penalty notices were issued for driving without a seatbelt.

Local residents have previously raised concerns over the speed at which tractors travel through the area. These were monitored and the average speed was 24-27mph.
