Chichester

Chichester: Maplehurst Road

Burglary: Between 1200hrs 16/12 and 1500hrs 2/1 a secure property has been broken in to and a large amount of electrical equipment including four laptops, one desk top computer, an Xbox, an Iphone and a large amount of jewellery has been stolen.
