Community Resolution

This is an alternative way of dealing with less serious offences and allows officers to use their professional judgement when dealing with offenders. It can be applied to offences such as low level public order, criminal damage, theft, and minor assaults.

When used in appropriate circumstances, Community Resolution will enable victims to reach effective resolution and closure to the crime which affected them. Offenders will receive speedy justice and there will be reduced bureaucracy for police officers.

Manhood East

Selsey: Peachey Road

Theft from Vehicle: Between 4.30pm 10/03 to 9am 11/03 access was gained to an insecure vehicle and items stolen from within.
