Community Resolution

This is an alternative way of dealing with less serious offences and allows officers to use their professional judgement when dealing with offenders. It can be applied to offences such as low level public order, criminal damage, theft, and minor assaults.

When used in appropriate circumstances, Community Resolution will enable victims to reach effective resolution and closure to the crime which affected them. Offenders will receive speedy justice and there will be reduced bureaucracy for police officers.

Manhood East

Selsey: St Peters Crescent

Theft: Between 12.05pm to 12.25pm a rear number plate was stolen from a vehicle when parked at the location.

Sussex Police STORM: 709 23/03/12 refers.

Selsey: West Sands Caravan Park

Break to Caravan: Between 10am and 12pm 23/3 access was gained to an insecure caravan at the location and a TV and cooking pans were stolen from within.

Bracklesham Bay: Middleton Close

Anti Social Behaviour: Ongoing issues with youths causing nuisance to local residents and causing damage to vehicles at the location.

Donnington: Selsey Road

Bike Theft: Between 23/3 and 24/3 access was gained to a rear garden and two bikes were stolen. A customised blue mountain bike with red pedals and a red BMX with stunt pegs.

Sidlesham: Easton Lane

Theft: Overnight on the 25th into the 26th of March 2012 a "John Deere Greenstar 2" agricultural satellite navigation system valued at around £8000 was stolen from a tractor parked in a farm in Sidlesham. There is a growing trend in the theft of these high value navigation systems across the country. If you own one or know someone that does please ensure it is removed from the vehicle it is in overnight if possible.

Itchenor: Itchenor Sailing Club

Theft: Over a period of a month an 8ft fibreglass dark blue and white dinghy was stolen from the location.

Bracklesham Bay: Middleton Close

Criminal Damage: At approximately 5pm a patio window at the location was smashed by accident after youths were playing in the area. Police attended and it is being dealt with via Community Resolution.

Almodington: Batchmere Road

Burglary: Between 3.30am and 5.30am on the 28/3 entry was gained to an insecure property and a laptop was stolen from within. The garage was also entered and numerous items stolen.

Highleigh: Highleigh Road

Burglary: Overnight 27/3 and 28/3 access was gained to an insecure property and two iPhones and an Apple computer was stolen.

Theft: Between 8pm 29/3 and 7.30am 30/3 a boat, left on the owner's driveway at the location had the engine cut out and removed.
